A beautiful area known as the Upper Valley; The Dartmouth/Lake Sunapee region has countless year-round family activities. The area offers four-season recreational opportunities via foot, bicycle, kayak, boat, snowshoes, or snowmobile. Boaters and swimmers can find their place on the water of Lake Sunapee, while others can enjoy the scenic Northern Recreational Rail Trail that begins in Lebanon and ends in the Merrimack Valley region in the town of Boscawen. During the winter months, there are many places for skiers to test out their skills on the slopes and there are also plenty of trails throughout the region for the snowmobiler to travel down.

Located on the western side of the state, the region welcomes historians, educators, and craftsmen alike where there's plenty of options to suit everyone. Visit the lively college town of Hanover or stop at the sculptured rock natural area in Groton where you will find an example of nature's unique artistry. In August, make sure to explore the week-long craft fair that the League of NH Craftsmen hosts in Newbury, which showcases over 350 artisans and their work. If you are a history buff, check out one of the many museums or historical sites the region has to offer. No matter where you chose to go, The Dartmouth/Lake Sunapee region is sure to keep your days occupied.

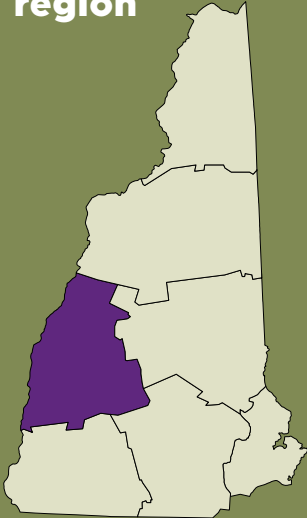

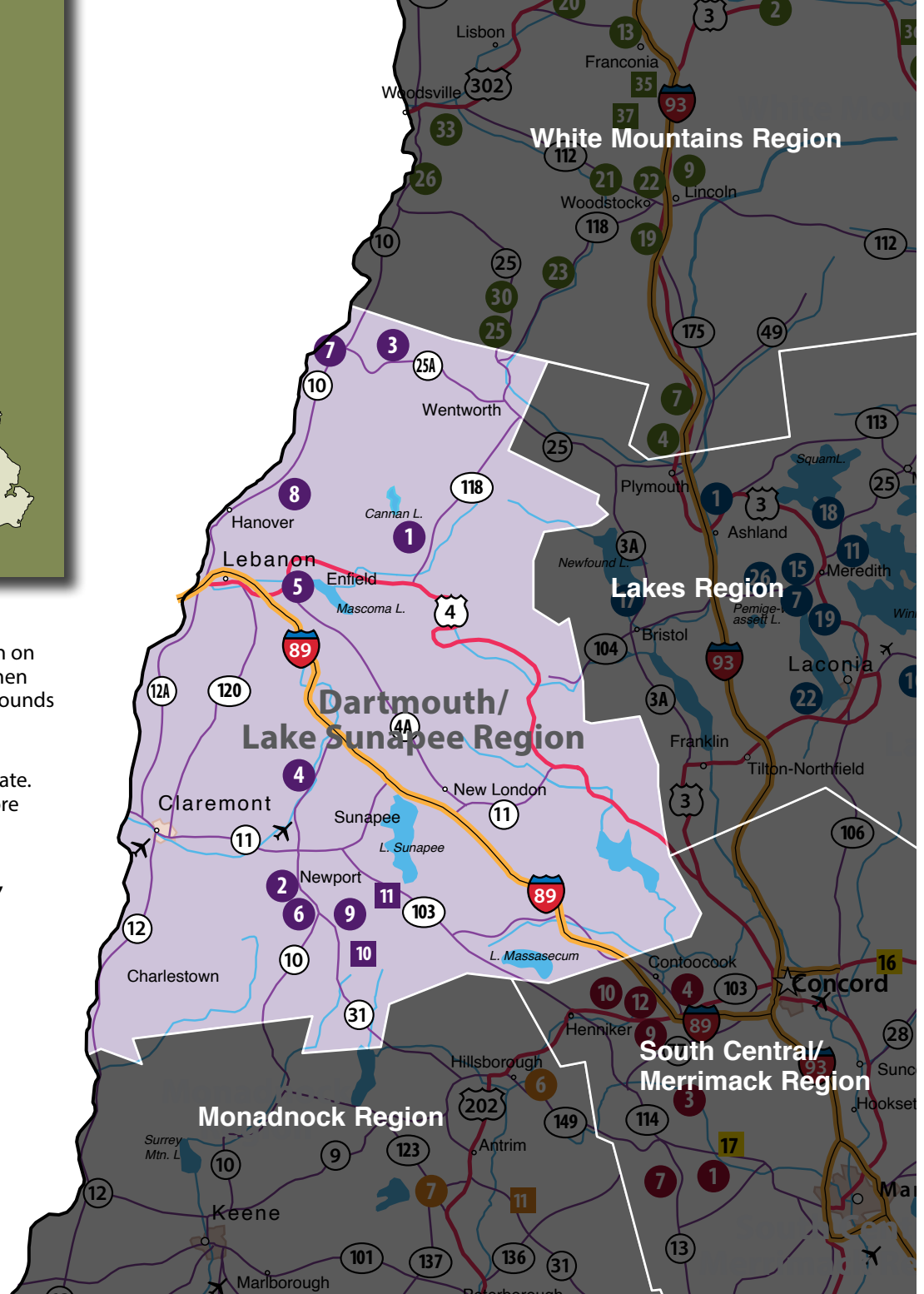

Directions 2 miles South of Newport on Route 10. I-89 North, exit 12 route 11W to Newport Ctr. I-89 South, exit 13 Route 10 south. I-91 in Vermont, exit 8 to Claremont, NH, follow signs to Newport. Note: When approaching Newport on Rt. 103, after passing Mt. Sunapee, avoid taking a left on Bradford Road. Continue on Rt. 103 until you intersect with Rt. 11 going to Newport. Big Rigs should consider using Exit 13 on I-89 and follow RT 10 South through Newport to avoid hilly terrain.

Follow signs to turn left to enter Storrs Pond. We suggest that campers over 40' access Storrs Pond by heading up East Wheelock St (1.3 miles) then take a left onto Grasse Road for 1.2 miles.

Amenities Located on the shore of the 13.5-acre Storrs Pond, sites have easy access to the hiking trails, pond and pool swimming, and the urban community of Hanover, New Hampshire. BOATING INFORMATION

All operators are required to obey laws that regulate your vessel's registration and operation.

Registering Your Vessel

You must have a New Hampshire Certificate of Registration and validation decals to operate your vessel legally on public waters in New Hampshire. This includes motorboats of any size (including those with electric motors) and sailboats or sailboards 12 feet in length or longer.

Only exceptions are:

- Sailboats and sailboards under 12 feet in length.
- Other small, non-motorized vessels such as canoes and kayaks.
- Vessels registered in other states using New Hampshire waters for 30 or fewer consecutive days.

The Certificate of Registration must be on board and available for inspection by an enforcement officer whenever the vessel is operated.

Where to Register

The Certificate of Registration and validation decals are obtained by submitting the proper application and fee to the New Hampshire Department of Safety, Division of Motor Vehicles, or one of its authorized agents. To obtain forms:

Who May Operate a Vessel

- A vessel powered by 25 horsepower or less does not require the operator to have a Safe Boater Education Certificate.
- A "ski craft" may only be operated by persons who are 16 years old or older who have a valid Safe Boater Education Certificate.
- A vessel powered by more than 25 horsepower (other than a ski craft) may be operated by:
- A person under 16 years of age only if he or she is accompanied by a person 18 years old or older who has a valid Safe Boater Education certificate. The accompanying person is responsible for any injury or damage caused during operation of the vessel.
- A person under 16 years of age or older only if he or she has obtained a Safe Boater Education Certificate.

Life Jackets (AKA: Personal Flotation Devices – PFD'S)

- Any child under the age of 13 must wear a life jacket. This life jacket has to be US Coast Guard approved, in serviceable condition, the proper size, proper type (Type I, II, III or V-only counts if worn).
- Stand Up Paddleboards are required to have a life jacket on board. Anyone under the age of 13 must be wearing it.
- For individuals 13 years old and older that are not wearing life jackets, they must be "Readily Accessible", which is defined as within arms reach.
- Vessels 16' and greater must have a type IV (US Coast Guard throwable device, IE. square cushion with straps, or throw ring) IN ADDITION to a wearable life jacket for each person on board.

Navigational Lights

- Non-Mechanical Powered Craft (IE. Canoe, Kayak, Paddle Boat, Rowboat, etc) must have one (1) white light visible 360 degrees to the horizon visible for two (2) miles from sunset to sunrise.
- Mechanical Powered Craft (IE. Powerboat, Canoe with an electric trolling motor used for propulsion) must have one (1) white light visible 360 degrees to the horizon visible for two (2) miles AND red (port side) and green (starboard side) navigational bow lights.

Additional Safety Equipment to have on board

- Sound Producing Device (required)
- Fire Extinguishers (required on mechanical craft)
- Anchor with line (recommended)
